

History

On August 1, 1977 C.J. Cherryh wrote a letter to twenty-four Oklahomans who were "interested or actively engaged in writing science fiction."

Thus, the Oklahoma Science Fiction Writers came into existence. Originally, there was a "section" in Oklahoma City and one in Tulsa, but distance divided the sections. Eventually, only the Tulsa group survived.

Over the years the group has included Hugo award winners such as R.A. Lafferty and Cherryh. The original vision for the group was that the professionals would conduct occasional workshops. The broader membership would meet regularly to for readings and peer critiques.

The Tulsa Oklahoma Science Fiction Writers have continued the tradition by meeting continuously since September of 1977, including virtual meetings during the COVID lockdowns.

R.A. Lafferty Fellowship

In 2000, an anonymous donor establishd the R.A. Lafferty fellowship. The purpose of the fellowship is to support members with dues and conference attendance fees.
